



VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

For the NOVEMBER 3, 2020 Election

YOU MUST BE REGISTERED TO VOTE WITH YOUR CURRENT NAME AND ADDRESS BEFORE REQUESTING AN ABSENTEE BALLOT

How to register:

- Check your voter registration at MyVote.wi.gov
- You can register online if you have a Wisconsin driver license or DOT-issued ID card.
- You can **register by mail** using a paper registration form. You will need to submit proof of residence with your application.
- **Deadline** for online registration and registration by mail is October 14.
- You can **register in person** until the Friday before the election at your municipal clerk's office or at any in-person absentee voting location. See your clerk's web site for dates and times.
- You can register **on Election Day** at your polling place.

Proof of Residence (address) is required for all mailed and in-person registrations.

If voting in person, you will need to show an approved photo ID: see bringit.wi.gov.

REQUEST AN ABSENTEE BALLOT NOW & RETURN IT PROMPTLY

- **Request your absentee ballot** at MyVote.wi.gov. You will be prompted to upload a copy of an **acceptable photo ID** if you do not already have one on file.
- If you are indefinitely confined to your home due to age, illness, or disability you may request a **Permanent absentee ballot**. Permanent absentee voters do **not** need to submit a photo ID. You can request the ballot at MyVote.wi.gov or submit your request by mail to your municipal clerk.
- When completing your ballot, read the instructions carefully, sign it, have it witnessed, and mail it back to your clerk promptly so it will arrive in time to be counted.
